

POLICE SCHEME TRAINER - National Speed Awareness Course

Locations: National

Reports To: Regional Training Manager.

Role overview: There are several courses regulated by UKROEd (UK Road Offender Education), which form part of the National Driver Offender Retraining Scheme (NDORS).

Whilst trainers are licensed by UKROEd, the training is undertaken by service providers, such as Drivetech. Courses are designed to offer drivers an educational alternative to prosecution for traffic offences, such as speeding.

National Speed Awareness Course – online/virtual (iNSAC)

Initially you would be trained by Drivetech to deliver iNSAC, with opportunities to progress to other courses dependent on your current qualifications, experience and aspirations.

National Speed Awareness Course – classroom (NSAC)

Depending on where you are located, there may be an opportunity to deliver courses face-to-face in a classroom environment, in addition to online delivery.

Essential

- You must hold a nationally recognised qualification in delivering training or teaching, such as the Award in Education and Training (Level 3, or above) or an equivalent teaching qualification.
- You must experience in delivering Training 1:1 or to groups for at least 1 year - we deliver up to 24 in classroom.
- You must have excellent Highway code knowledge, preferably holding an industry qualification e.g. Approved Driving Instructor, Motorcycle Instructor, HGV, Police driving experience or other Advanced Driver Training qualification e.g. RoSPA.
